

Featured Speakers

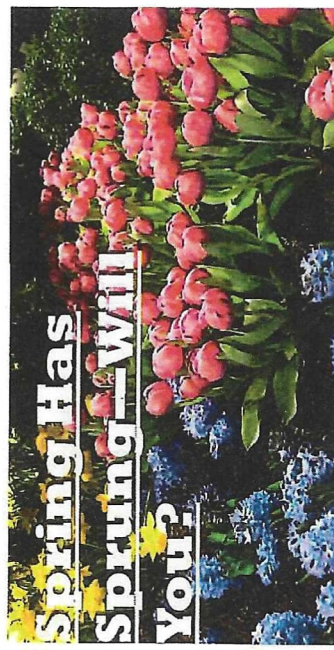
Dr. Salma Brillman from Palo Alto California has been practicing neurology for over 20 years. She received a BA in Psychology from Loyola Marymount University, a Master's in Neuroscience at the University of Hartford, a Post-Baccalaureate Pre-Med program from Columbia University, then completed Medical School in Guadalajara, Mexico. Dr. Brillman also completed her Residency and Neurology fellowship in Pittsburgh Pennsylvania.

Recognizing the need for continuous care for people with movement disorders, Dr. Brillman became one of the first concierge neurologists in the Bay Area, seeing patients in her office, in their homes or via telemedicine.

Dr. Matthew Barrett first spoke at our annual symposium a couple of years ago and we have had numerous requests to bring him back. Dr Barrett received his medical degree from the University of Virginia and then completed his Movement Disorder Fellowship at Beth Israel in NY. He also completed an MS in Clinical Research from Albert Einstein College of Medicine. Dr. Barrett has done extensive Parkinson's disease research and is well published. He currently is involved in patient care and research as an associate professor at Virginia Commonwealth University

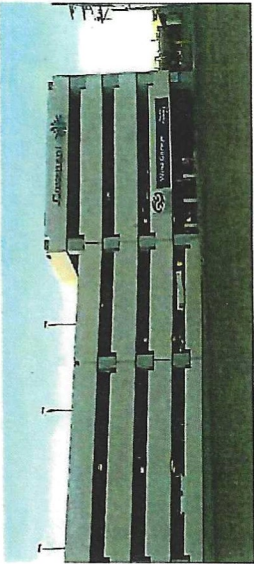
If you register and are unable to attend please kindly let us know so we can cancel your reservation. A symposium of this magnitude is a very costly. Please help us be good stewards.

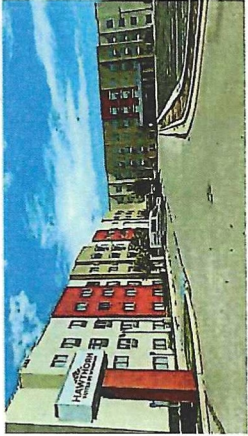

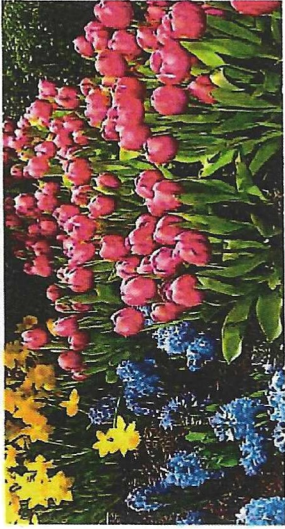
